During Term as Mayor the City of Fairfield has improved to the lowest overall debt and property tax rate in the State of Texas. It has the no. 1 rate volunteer fire department and police department in Texas population under 50,000. The first city in the State to restore live “nativity activities” to Christmas and the City that lead the fight of opening public meetings with Prayer and Pledges to the U.S. and State Flags. Fairfield has the largest industrial park in the State population under 50,000. It has the rating of “Superior” for its water supply and is in the lowest 5% as to water and waste water rates in Texas. Their bond rating is “A-“. In January of 2017 it will have the only “Baylor-Scott and White” hospital rating with its own care flight and ambulance services.

- Assisted in the merger of Belmas, later Davis Belmas, pressure vessel company into what is now Fluor of Houston, Texas;
- Assisted in setting up American Energy Services which makes some pressure valves that meet and exceed API standards. They are now located in 35 counties around the world;
- Involved with my Father in attracting the first modern day (early 70’s) coal generation plant in Texas to be built and located at Fairfield, Texas;
- Instrumental in bringing Nucor Steel to Jewett, Texas;
- Helped form Saxton Petroleum for development of oil & gas fields in Texas and Oklahoma;
- Developed and implemented coal acquisition programs for Dow Chemical; TXU (now Vistra);
- Involved and helped advise on set up of first successful MLP’s with IRS approval;
- Director in old First National Bank which became Interfirst, then merged with Republic and ultimately became NCNB;
- Acted as advisor for various TXU management until 2007 on mining, environmental, power generation, corporate development and regulatory matters on both State and Federal levels;
- Formed the highly successful Texans for Affordable and Reliable Power. (T.A.R.P) and became its first President to educate the general public, cities, counties, State, Federal governments and National organizations about our energy needs, the environmental, supplies and costs of each;

- Helped advise 4- Corners Development Corporation relative to coal mining and electric generation in New Mexico, (originally BHP Bilton project);
- Advocate and advisor before regulatory commissions and agencies at State and Federal levels;
- Have provided expert testimony during the development of key legislation and regulations for energy, petroleum, coal and power industries;

I am currently the Chairman of the Board, President and majority shareholder;

- Have done numerous, but not able to disclose, crisis management projects for major oil, chemical, coal and power companies;
- Founded over 13 fields, mostly in Texas, that include early “chalk development” and the “Bossier Play” located in Freestone County, Texas that became for over 10 years the largest onshore lower 48 onshore natural gas producer in the U.S.A. Early participants included Exxon, Anadarko and Phillip’s Petroleum;
- Assisted in over 1,500 miles of pipeline set up and operation.
